
History Key Vocabulary

	reliability	Capable of being trusted or relied on.
	artefact	Any object made by human beings of historical interest.
	AD	Anno Domini - refers to the years after the birth of Jesus Christ.
	BCE	Before the Common Era - refers to the years that came before the birth of Jesus Christ.
	chronological	Things placed in order of time.
	civilisation	A group of people with their own languages and way of life.
	hierarchy	A system of organising people into different ranks or levels of importance.
	kingdom	A country whose ruler is a king or queen.
	pharaoh	A ruler in ancient Egypt.
