### World War Two - 1939 to 1945

1. World War One started in 1914 and finished in 1918, lasting for 4 years.

2. The Final Solution was Hitler's plan to eradicate and persecute the Jewish population.

3. Appeasement is where you give someone what they want in order to prevent conflict.

4. Great Britain, France, USSR and the USA formed the allies.



Germany, Italy and Japan formed the axis.



5. The invasion of Gdansk by Germany was a catalyst for the start of World War Two.

- Or, they were, impacted physically, mentally and socially.

7. The Battle of Dunkirk took place from the 26<sup>th</sup> May - 4<sup>th</sup> June, 1940. It was the evacuation of French and British troops.

8. The Battle of Britain was important because it blocked the Nazi invasion and occupation of Britain.



9. The role of women changed in both world wars as they filled industrial positions left vacant by men.

10. Propaganda was used by both British and German governments to influence the general public.



11. Rationing was introduced in Britain due to a national shortage of food and goods.

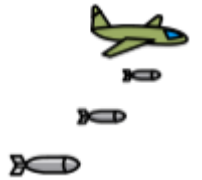
12. VE Day was on the 8<sup>th</sup> May, 1945. Following Germany's surrender the day before.

18. An audience is the person or people who a product is intended for.













19. Some food items can be kept for longer if they are frozen.

20. Items that are frozen need to be defrosted properly.







### History Key Vocabulary
